This exhaustive digital archive combines two world-class collections—the Goldsmiths’ Library of Economic Literature at the University of London and the Kress Collection of Business and Economics at the Harvard Business School—along with supplementary materials from the Seligman Collection in the Butler Library at Columbia University and from Sterling Library at Yale University—fully documenting the workings of Western trade and capital from the second half of the 15th century to the mid-19th century. *The Making of the Modern World* is the most comprehensive collection of primary sources in economic, political, business, and social history literature from this period. It includes all editions of major works by English economists, important first editions, and other primary source materials such as broadsides, pamphlets, government publications, and an extensive assortment of ephemera. The database represents multiple languages and cultures, and covers subject areas such as agriculture, colonies, commerce, mercantilism, finance, politics, population, slavery, social conditions, socialism, and manufacturing.
