Biographical Note

Charles E. Cory was born in Thornburg, Iowa on December 6, 1878. He studied at Drake University (earning an A.B. in 1901 and an A.M. in 1902), Yale University (earning an A.M. in 1903 and a Ph.D. in 1904), Harvard University (earning a S.T.B. degree in 1907), and the Universities of Berlin and Leipzig. Cory started his career at Washington University as an instructor in 1907. By 1920 he was a professor of Philosophy, and in 1921 he became the head of the Philosophy Department, a position which he maintained until his retirement in 1949. After retiring, he was named the Professor Emeritus of Philosophy at Washington University. Cory died in St. Louis on March 2, 1965.

This collection is chiefly comprised of typescripts by Charles E. Cory. Also included are some handwritten notes and a reprint of one of Cory's articles. The materials in this collection are arranged alphabetically by title of publication.
