Born in rural Nova Scotia and later educated at Harvard University, W. Roy Mackenzie was a faculty member of Washington University in the Department of English for 42 years beginning in 1918. He is considered by many to be the greatest authority on Shakespeare in America.

These papers comprise of Mackenzie's notes from courses that he taught at Washington University, a few personal writings, and numerous items that chronicle his interest in military matters from World War I and World War II.
