Series 9: Records of the Committee for Social Service Among Colored People

Historical note: The Committee for Social Service Among Colored People, formed in 1910, was a predecessor to the St. Louis Urban League. One of the founders of the organization was Roger Baldwin, later the founder of the American Civil Liberties Union.
